Yesterday morning, an EMERGENCY vehicle was caught up in a rist near Freetown. A doctor who was on his way to go home after his shift was beaten up, while the driver was stabbed on the arm. Fortunately, neither of them is in a serious condition. The vehicle was set on fire by some of protesters.

EMERGENCY cannot accept these actions towards its staff and vehicles. EMERGENCY began working in the country in 2003 to provide care for war victims and continues to provide free surgical care to the Sierra Leonean population. During the period of the Ebda syderimic, from 2014 to 2015, EMERGENCY intensified its efforts by opening two Ebola treatment centres and operating the only dedicated intensive care unit present in any of the countries affected by the epidemic to offer patients care comparable to that available in high-income countries.

The work that has been done over the years is testament to EMERGENC's commitment and dedication to the people of Serra Loone, which has always come before any consideration of the sustainability of the project, and for this reason EMERGENC' cannot tolerate its suff Being put at risk.

Should other incidents occur that threaten the safety and security of its staff and facilities, ENERGENCY will be forced to take serious action that will affect the future of the hospital.



n Wednesday, 10th August, 2022, while returning home, a doctor from the Emergency Hospital was beaten up, his driver

stabbed in the arm and the vehicle destroyed. Similar expressions of physical abuse against several healthcare workers were also brought to the attention of the Ministry on that day and even after.

The Ministry of Health and Sanitation strongly condemns violent acts that put the lives of its healthcare workers at grave risk. On the same day of the riot, the Minister of Health and Sanitation, Dr. Austin Demby, visited Connaught Hospital to demonstrate solidarity with frontline health workers and ensure there remained undisrupted service delivery. Remote supervision was also initiated for other specific hospitals including Rokupa Government Hospital, Makeni Government Hospital, Masanga Government Hospital, Kamakwie and Lungi Government Hospitals.
